


Homework Help

- **Math and More:** Students in the St. Helens and Scappoose School Districts can access math homework help and insightful videos through a partnership with Engage New York Homework. The service covers Pre-K through 6. You'll find more at engageny.org/mathematics.
- **Tutoring:** Pre-screened tutors are available for St. Helens School District students at 503.366.7226 or donnar@sthelens.k12.or.us. For tutors in the Scappoose and Rainier School Districts, contact your student's counselor.
- **Talk to Their Teacher:** Some teachers have discovered that sending kids home with less homework can improve overall retention of materials and increase assessment test scores. If your child's teacher sends a lot of homework your way, ask about reducing your student's "second shift" and the teacher's need to grade all of that homework.



Supplies:

- Paper Plate
- School Glue
- Scissors
- Colorful Leaves
- Ribbon or Twine

Instructions:

1. Collect leaves from outside. If they are wet, lay out to dry before beginning the project.
2. Cut plate into a ring shape by drawing a circle in the center and carefully cutting with scissors. If you need help cutting, ask an adult for assistance.
3. Use glue to attach the leaves. Allow to dry completely, adding a second layer of leaves if necessary.
4. Loop some ribbon or twine around the wreath.
5. Hang and enjoy the beautiful fall colors!
