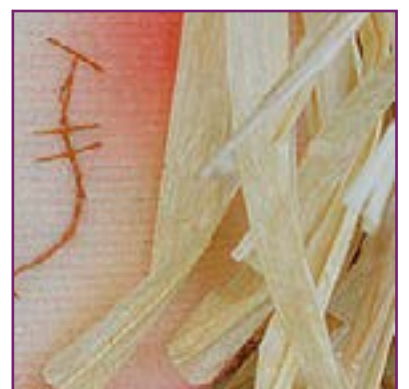

Leaf Press

Have you found some leaves you'd like to save? Pressing those leaves can help preserve them for many years. Here's how:

Supplies:

- Leaves that have not completely dried out
- Plastic sandwich bags (one for each leaf)
- Paper towels
- Wax paper
- Heavy books
- Scissors (get your parent's help)
- Tape



Instructions:

1. Collect your favorite leaves before they have started to dry out.
2. Place each leaf between two sheets of paper towel.
3. Cut two pieces of wax paper to cover the paper towels. Ask your parents for help.
4. Tape the edges of the wax paper to keep the paper towels and leaf in place.
5. Put everything into a heavy book. Then, close the book and lay it on its side.
6. Repeat the process for each leaf.
7. Leave them in the book for 1-2 months.
8. When they're ready, take the leaves out of the book and store them in sandwich bags.
