

Festive Wood Signs with Shannon Quimby

JOY UPCYCLED DOOR SIGN

Materials:

- Old cupboard door
- Stencil letters: J, O → Y
- 150 grit sandpaper
- Utility knife or flat head screwdriver
- Scissors
- Ruler
- · Paint brushes
- White → red pant
- Painter's tape
- Rag

How to:

- 1. Remove any hardware from the door.
- 2. If the door has a finish, lightly sand, and wipe off the dust.
- 3. Apply one coat of white paint on the door and let it dry.
- 4. Sand the white paint, just enough to expose the under color of the door, then wipe of dust.
- 5. Position, measure, mark and tape in place the three letters, equally apart on the board.
- 6. Trace the outline of each letter with a pencil.
- 7. Remove letters and with utility knife or flat head screwdriver, press and indent along the penciled letter lines into the wood. This process might need to be repeated a few times.
- 8. Paint outlined letters with red paint. Two Coats will be needed and let the paint dry between Coats.
- 9. Sand the letters to expose some of the undercoat white paint color, wipe off dust with rag.



PLANK CHRISTMAS TREE SIGNS

Materials:

- Three pieces of 1x4 spruce wood each cut 24" long
- Dark wood stain
- Rags
- Pencil
- Watercolor paintbrushes in various sizes
- Acrylic white paint
- (Jpholstery tacks)
- Hammer
- Rope or twine
- Scissors

How to:

- 1. Stain wood, wipe of excess and let dry
- 2. Sketch an outline of three different tree shapes/designs, one on each board
- 3. With white paint, paint over each tree design and let dry
- 4. Cut three pieces of rope 12" long
- 5. Place one end of rope along the edge of the board approximately 2 inches from the top of the board
- 6. With hammer, tap an upholstery tack on the rope's end, securing it to the board
- 7. Repeat step 6 alongside the board's other edge
- 8. Do steps 6 and 7 for the other two boards
- 9. Remove letters and with utility knife or flat head screwdriver, press and indent along the penciled letter lines into the wood. This process might need to be repeated a few times.
- 10. Paint outlined letters with red paint. Two Coats will be needed and let the paint dry between Coats
