

INTEREST RATES AND INTEREST CHARGES	
Annual Percentage Rate (APR) for Purchases	12.74 % to 18.00 % based on your creditworthiness when you open the Account. This rate will vary with the market based on the Prime Rate.
Annual Percentage Rate (APR) for Cash Advances	14.74 % to 18.00 % based on your creditworthiness when you open the Account. This rate will vary with the market based on the Prime Rate.
Annual Percentage Rate (APR) for Balance Transfers	12.74 % to 18.00 % based on your creditworthiness when you open the Account. This rate will vary with the market based on the Prime Rate.
Penalty APR and When it Applies	18% This APR may be applied to your account if your minimum monthly payment is more than 60 days late. How long will the Penalty APR Apply? If your APRs are increased for this reason, the Penalty APR will apply until you make six consecutive minimum payments when due.
How to Avoid Paying Interest on Purchases	Your due date is approximately 25 days after the close of each billing cycle. We will not charge any interest on the portion of the purchases balance that you pay by the due date each month.
